The show culminated with Angel and many of the dancers doing Bulerias, to the great excitement of the audience, so much so that Angel couldn't resist bringing 3 excited little boys in the front row, onto the stage to dance with him.

The wonderful thing about this show was the camaraderie amongst all the teachers and students. Everyone got on with each other, and the atmosphere on stage and back stage was electrifying.

All in all an experience we will all remember for years to come.

Straight after the show, Angel, Geoffrey, Mavis and I went to Cape Town where Angel did another wonderful course with the very talented Cape Town dancers.

This too, like the rest of the celebrations was much enjoyed by everyone and was culminated by a great party put together by all the teachers.

50th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION IN VALENCIA, SPAIN RHODA RIVKIND

At the beginning of December, 12 South Africans travelled to Spain to continue celebrating our 50th Anniversary.

It was a wonderful week in Valencia – everyone from England, Europe, Thailand, Australia, Canada and South Africa stayed at the same hotel and literally took up the entire hotel.

All the celebrations in Valencia were wonderfully organised by Sherrill Wexler (England) and Maria Jesus de Bayarri (Valencia).

We were very happy that our Hon. Life President, Dame Marina Keet, who has done so much for our Society, attended the celebrations in Valencia with her husband, Mikael Grut.

The week started off with courses taught by Angel Muñoz, his wife Charo Espino and his brother-in-law Miguel Espino. At the same time Angel and Miguel choreographed 2 beautiful ballets, a Classical and Flamenco.

The show (for invited guests only) at the *Palau de La Musica* was opened with a short introduction by Theo Dantes, who then called onto the stage Dame Marina Keet, Sir Geoffrey Neiman and Maria Jesus de Bayarri, who all made short introductory speeches in Spanish and English. The show then commenced and comprised of a demonstration of the SDS syllabus in the first half, and in the 2nd half the dancers from Maria Jesus, and the 2 ballets choreographed by Angel and Miguel, and culminated with solos and duets danced by Angel, Charo, Miguel & Inma, (another teacher who has been to South Africa to teach several times.)

We were very proud that **OUR** three dancers, Mari, Monique and Roslynne were chosen to take part in these ballets. All the other dancers were from England and Europe, as well as three dancers from the other countries under the jurisdiction of South Africa – Lalita Jantaro (Bangkok), Lyn Martlew (Perth) and Maritel Centurion (Winnipeg).

Our trip wasn't all dancing, and Geoffrey, Brian, Tanya and I went on tours, we went shopping, out for coffees and meals in the sidewalk cafes, and all in all just had a wonderful time.

The highlight of our tour was a reunion in Madrid. The 4 of us, together with Mavis and her daughter Luisa got the bullet train to Madrid where we re-united with 3 dancers we had all danced with 52 years ago in Luisillo's Company. The excitement was great, and tears flowed when we saw each other. We all went out for a drink, then went out for lunch and we just talked and talked about the past. They all came to the station to see us off and it was very sad, as we wondered if we would ever see them again.

Our grateful thanks go to Luisa Mazinter (Mavis's daughter) who took the initiative to film a documentary while we were in Valencia, reflecting on the past 50 years of the Society as told by the original members of the Society and those still organising the Society.
